Under his guidance, the college has achieved the prestigious NAAC Accreditation with an A Grade in the academic year 2023-24. His leadership has also enabled the college to consistently secure top ranks at the university level, with many students achieving outstanding success. He has provided unwavering support and guidance to both faculty members and students, empowering them to reach new heights. His mentorship and leadership have inspired a culture of excellence, fostering a community of scholars who strive for academic distinction.

His achievements have been recognized and celebrated, including the prestigious Best Principal Award in 2015. This honor is a testament to his exceptional teaching skills, dedication, and passion for education. - Question: As you prepare to retire, beyond just happiness, what emotions are you experiencing at thismoment?
- Answer: I am truly content at this moment. Retiring fills me with a deep sense of accomplishment because I know I have given my absolute best to this college. Every moment has been spent with intention and purpose, and my efforts have been wholehearted and unwavering. There are no regrets only a profound sense of fulfillment and pride in what I have achieved. This feels less like a farewell and more like a celebration of a meaningful journey, paving the way for an exciting new chapter.
- Question: What inspired you to pursue a career in education?
- Answer: Not because of inspiration it was my dream to enter the educational field. after completing my masters, I choose to follow my passion instead of exploring other career paths.Determined to become a teacher, I attended interviews and, with my second interview, I secured a job, at St. Thomas College, Pala. I worked 25 years as a teacher there, and later the principal at Devamatha College Kuravilangadu for 4 more years. Theseyears have been the most fulfilling and rewarding chapters of my professional life.
- Question: what has been your proudest achievement as the principal at MAC?
- Answer: One of my most fulfilling and proudest moments as the Principal at MAC was achieving an A grade in the NAAC Accreditation. Alongside this milestone, the college also received several other notable recognitions, including KIRF, NIRF, and UGC recognition too.
- Question: What have been the major challenges you faced during your tenure as the Principal of MAC College?
- Answer: Fortunately, I did not faced any significant difficulties during my term as the Principal of MAC College. One of the key reasons for this was the dedication and commitment of the faculty members, who were hardworking and fully devoted to the institution's success. Similarly, the students played an essential role in fostering a positive environment in this college. They were diligent, respectful, and cooperative. Unlike some institutions, where students may create challenges by going against administration or the institution's values. However, compared to other institutions, the students here showed remarkable discipline and a strong sense of responsibility. They are good at academics, extracurricular activities like arts, sports etc.
- Question: Sir, looking back on your career, what do you consider as you're the most significant achievement as a principal or as a teacher?
- Answer: As a teacher, I take great pride in shaping the character of thousands of students. Just last week, a student I taught back in 2000 came to visit me. It means a lot to know that my students shall remember me

even after so many years. One of the proudest milestones in my career came when I received a letter from St. Thomas College, pala, after I came out from that college, regarding a student survey was conducted, where they requested the principal to have all teachers resign and let the students choose whom to reappoint. Out of 70 to 75 teachers, only 16 were selected again, and I was fortunate to be one of them. That was truly the best recognition I could receive as a teacher. That's the proudest moment because students recognized me as a teacher, not as a principal. Teaching has always been my greatest happiness. It's was my passion. Principal is an administrative position. I couldn't teach much at MAC College. But the limited opportunities to step into the classroom felt like a significant loss perhaps.

- Question: what inspired you to pursue a career in education, and what motivates you to continue making a difference?
- Answer: As I early said, teaching was my passion, so that I chose teaching. When I completed my BA, I started teaching students through tuition, and they said, you have grace for teaching. That truly inspired me. After completing BA, I took a year to reflect on my future and then decided to pursue MA. The positive feedback from my students gave me the courage and conviction to choose teaching as my career.When I became the principal, I didn't focus on making comparisons with other principals or bringing unnecessary changes to the college. Instead, I tried to achieve what the college was lacking, such as securing UGC recognition and undergoing NAAC assessments. These were not easy tasks, but they were necessary for the institution's growth. I dedicated myself to filling these gaps and worked hard over the years to bring about meaningful improvements.
- Question: Were there any personal sacrifices you had to make to fulfill your duties as principal?
- Answer: Yes, absolutely. There were many sacrifices I had to make. One of the most difficult situation was missing numerous family gatherings and functions hosted by friends. My responsibilities as principal often kept me tied up, leaving me little time for personal engagements. Through it all, my greatest support was my wife. Her unwavering presence and understanding made everything possible. She attended events and represented me at places where I couldn't be present, ensuring that our absence didn't raise questions or disrupt relationships. Without her support and dedication, it would have been incredibly challenging to balancemy duties with the personal sacrifices they required. She truly was my pillar of strength during those demanding times.

Question: As you retire, what are your future plans?

- Answer: My plan is to dedicate myself to agriculture, something I have always loved and continue to enjoy. Even now, I spend more than an hour every evening tending to my crops.Everything we need for our home i harvested right in our own backyard. That self-sufficiency and connection to the earth are what I cherish the most.
- Question: From being professor to the principal of many colleges how did you balance your personal and professional life?
- Answer: Balancing my personal and professional life as I transitioned from professor to principal was not easy, but I believe in the results of my commitment. The greatest reward for my dedication has been seeing my children grow and achieve so much in life that is something I hold closest to my heart.
- Question: As you retire, what message do you want to leave for the students and faculty?
- Answer: My message is to continue striving for excellence and making the college proud. We are blessed with countless opportunities embrace them, explore them, and make the most of what is available to you.Organize more programs, create a vibrant and dynamic atmosphere on campus, and keep the energy alive. During my time at MAC, I made it a priority to promote a variety of programs, and together with my dedicated faculty, we achieved remarkable results among the students. 

MAR AUGUSTHINOSE COLLEGE RAMAPURAM DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY (DST) INSPIRE INTERNSHIP SCIENCE CAMP 2024

Department of Science and Technology (DST) sponsored **Inspire Internship Science Camp** was held from **23.09.2024 to 27.09.2024** at Mar Augusthinose College, Ramapuram, Kottayam Dt, Kerala 686576, a NAAC accredited 'A' grade college, affiliated with MG University Kottayam. At the outset itself, we take this opportunity to thank **The Department of Science and Technology** for sanctioning this much coveted INSPIRE Internship programme to our college, a college set against a georgic milieu. It is the first camp ever conducted in a rural community, the Ramapuram village.

Upon receiving the sanction order from the DST, wide publicity about the programme was given through the news papers. We convened a Press cum channel meet at Palai to publicize the camp throughout Kerala. We also convened a meeting of Higher Secondary Principals in Kottayam district to conscientize them of the significance of INSPIRE science camp. In addition, the college deputed different teams of faculty members to various Higher Secondary schools in Kottayam and neighbouring districts. More than 50 schools were visited by the faculty. In each school, the authorities assembled XI class students with 97% and above marks in their X class to make them aware of the importance of DST sponsored Inspire Internship Programme. The prepared brochures and postures on INSPIRE were distributed among the students. The college also composed and released a **THEME SONG** for the DST INSPIRE Science camp. Later we submitted the theme song to the DST for their suggestion. We are indeed elated to announce that the DST has taken up our theme song for all its future INSPIRE camps. We also interacted with managements of all higher secondary schools so as to motivate their students to participate in this programme. We also made available the online application in the DST format to all the eligible candidates for registration.

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In response to our wide publicity in the media and interaction with students of Class XI, 170 students, who fulfilled the eligibility criterion stipulated by DST, submitted their applications in the DST format showing their interest in joining this programme. We prepared a short list of the received applications on the basis of their class X marks. The first 150 eligible short-listed candidates were intimated about their selection to the camp through their mobile. The remaining eligible candidates in the short list were wait listed and intimated the same to the candidates through their mobile. A list of selected candidates, wait listed candidates and the procedures to be followed during the entire camp was also sent to the managements of various schools. We also formed the WhatsApp groups of both the candidates and their parents to send them instructions from time to time.

Meanwhile, the Principal of the College Dr. Joy Jacob and the Programme Coordinator Dr. Sajeshkumar N.K assembled the faculty members of all the Science Departments of the college to discuss the conduct of DST sponsored Inspire Internship Science Camp. In this meeting various committees were formed for the smooth running of the programme. The Principal and the Coordinator decided to select 12 best students of the institution as Student Mentors, who would guide and lead the camp interns during the camp.

We communicated with the Academic Mentors selected for the camp and approved by the DST over mobile and through their email IDs and invited them to interact with the participants as mentors in the forenoon academic sessions. **8 mentors** responded positively to be present for the different sessions from 23/9 to 27.09.2024. **Out of the 9 sessions, two sessions were earmarked for Institutional Visit.**

INAUGURAL SESSION

The official inauguration of the 5-day INSPIRE Internship Science Camp commenced at 9:30 am. In the meeting presided over by the college Manager, **Rev. Fr. Berchmans Kunnumpuram**, the chief guest **Dr. Babu K Joseph**, the former Vice Chancellor of CUSAT (Cochin University of Science and Technology) delivered the key note address and **Mar Joseph Kallarangattu**, the Bishop of Palai, officially inaugurated the camp by lighting the lamp. **The Principal** welcomed the gathering and the Coordinator explained to the interns about DST and INSPIRE. He briefly enlightened the interns about the funding agency, DST, and its aim in promoting and igniting deep curiosity for STEM Subjects. He explicated the difference between an IT professional and an academician with some examples. Vice Principal **Ms Siji Jacob** felicitated the gathering and Vice Principal **Rev. Fr. Joseph Alenchery** proposed the vote of thanks. The inaugural session commenced with the **DST-INSPIRE Theme Song** composed by the college and ended at 11:00 AM with the

The evening interactive sessions were engaged by Dr. Ebin Deny Raj Dean, IIIT Kottayam, Prof. Dr. Beena Mathew, Dean School of Chemical Sciences, MG University, Kottayam, Dr. George Varghese Njarakunnel, the former Manager, Dr. Stany Thomas, Member, Kerala Public Service Commission, Dr. Joseph Thadathil, Syncellus, Diocese of Pala, Dr Prof. V.P Devassia, Principal St Joseph's Engineering College, Pala and Dr. Betty Varghese, Gynecologist, Mar Sleeva Medicity, Pala.

In the evening on 25.09.2024 the interns had the rare opportunity to watch the stars and constellations through high density microscopes. **The Break-Through Science Society, Kottayam Chapter: Learning Science through Experiments**, came to the campus with their sophisticated equipments for Sky Watch. This novel venture was a new experience to the interns.

On 26.09.2024 all the interns were taken on INSTITUTIONAL VISIT to the **IIIT Kottayam**, an institute 10 KM away from the college. The interns were accompanied by student mentors and faculty members. They reached the venue at 10 am. The IIIT authorities conducted the interns on a tour of the campus and especially their highly sophisticated and modernized laboratories. After the tour of the campus the registrar of IIIT addressed the interns in the central hall briefing them about the programmes conducted at IIIT, prospectus in Science and the process of admission to IITs, IIITs and NITs. No interns of the camp had ever visited an IIIT or IIT in their life. The fantabulous experience at IIIT further triggered their interest to pursue programmes in science and seek careers in engineering and technology.

HABITS

Habits are formed through repetition and are reinforced by their outcomes, either positive or negative. Habits can be separated into two types:

Good habits: These are constructive the behaviors ,that contribute to personal growth, health, and success, such as exercising, eating healthily, deep learning, or practicing gratitude. Bad habits: These are the things that can hinder progress or have negative consequences, such as procrastination, overeating or smoking.

Habits are like the atoms of our lives. Each one is fundamental unit that contributes to your overall improvement. At first, these tiny routines seem insignificant, but soon build on each other and fuel bigger wins that multiply to a degree that far outweighs the cost of their initial investment. If you want achieve a goals, forget about goals, focus on system instead. What's the difference between systems and goals? Goals are about the results you want to achieve. Systems are about the processes that lead to those results. If you're a coach, your goal might be to win a championship. Your system is the way you recruit players, manage your assistant coaches, and conduct practice.

Goals are good for setting a direction, but systems are best for making progress. A handful of problems arise when you spend too much time thinking about your goals and not enough time designing your systems. Winners and losers have the same goals: Goal setting suffers from a serious case of survivorship bias. We concentrate on the people who end up winning the survivors and mistakenly assume that ambi-

tious goals led to their success while overlooking all of the people who had the same objective but didn't succeed.



Every candidate wants to get the job. And ,if successful and unsuccessful people share the same goals, then the goal cannot be what differentiates the winners from the losers. The goal had always been there. It was only when they implemented a system of continuous small improvements that they achieved a different outcome.

Achieving a goal is only a momentary change: imagine you have a messy room and you set a goal to clean it. You summon the energy to tidy up, then you will have a clean room for now. But if you maintain the same sloppy, pack rat habits the led to a messy room in the first place, soon you'll be looking at a new pile of clutter and hoping for another burst motivation. Achieving a goal only changes your life for the moment.

Goals restrict your happiness: Once i reach my goal, then i'll be happy." The problem with a goals first mentality is that you're continually putting happiness off until the next milestone. Goals create an "either-or" conflict: either you achieve your goal and are successful or you fail and you are the disappointment. Goals are at odds with long term progress: A goal-oriented mindset can create a "yo-yo" effect. Many runners work hard for months, but as soon as they cross the finish line, they stop training. The race is longer. The race is no longer there to motivate them. True longterm thinking is goal-less thinking. It's not about any single accomplishment

If you're having trouble changing your habits, the problem isn't you. The problem is your system . Bad habits repeat themselves again and again not because you don't want to change, but because you have the wrong system for change.




The Echo of Love

She no longer needed her teacher's validation-she had given herself her own.




The Privacy trade-off: Sacrificing privacy for convenience
